Day 1: Arrive in Iqaluit

Fly from Ottawa to Iqaluit and meet your Arctic Kingdom host. Visit a local fur clothier showcasing both traditional and modern styles, and tour the Legislative Assembly. Enjoy a catered dinner at Arctic Kingdom's Beach House before your first aurora photography workshop and evening Northern Lights viewing.

Day 2–3 : Explore Iqaluit Culture and Slyvia Grinnell Park

Explore Iqaluit with city and museum tours, a brewery lunch, artisan shopping, and outdoor adventures in Sylvia Grinnell Park. Enjoy Inuit cultural performances and sewing workshops, with nightly opportunities to view the aurora.

Fly by ski-plane into the wilderness and begin with a lodge orientation.
Spend your days snowmobiling, quinzhee/igloo building, and skating. In the evenings, take part in guided aurora viewing and photography sessions. Optional flight-seeing tours to Twin Falls Gorge are also available.

Yellowknife, Northwest Territories

Known as one of the world's top auroraviewing capitals, Yellowknife combines vibrant northern hospitality with endless skies. Stroll through local shops and galleries, enjoy the warmth of Canada's northern culture, and prepare for the next stage of your journey. With clear skies and expansive horizons, this lively city is the perfect gateway to the wilderness beyond.



Blachford Lodge

Accessible only by ski-plane, Blachford Lodge offers a true wilderness escape. Nestled among frozen lakes and boreal forest, the lodge provides cozy accommodations, gourmet meals, and rustic charm. Here, you can snowmobile, skate, or even build an igloo by day, while evenings invite you to relax in a hot tub or by a bonfire under the brilliant Northern Lights.



Travel arrangements between your point of origin and Ottawa International Airport (YOW) are the responsibility of each participant. From Ottawa, flights north to Iqaluit and onward connections are included in your package, along with a private charter ski-plane to Blachford Lodge. Please note that flights from Yellowknife (YZF) back to your point of origin are also the responsibility of the guest. Detailed flight itineraries and transfer information will be provided prior to departure.

Any deviation from a ticketed itinerary may result in penalties, regardless of the cause. To ensure a stress-free return, we encourage guests to allow buffer time in their travel plans to accommodate possible weather-related delays.

Physical Requirements

This trip is not physically demanding, but very cold conditions should be expected. Guests should be comfortable walking short distances in snow and ice and getting in and out of small aircraft used for travel between locations.

No prior Arctic experience is necessary, but curiosity, flexibility, and an adventurous outlook are essential. Weather and aurora activity can be unpredictable, and an open-minded, patient approach ensures the best experience. Guests who embrace the Arctic's unique pace will fully enjoy both the natural wonders and cultural encounters.

Temperature: -26°C (-14.8°F) to -6°C (42.8°F)

Conditions: Variable; sunny, windy, cloudy, snowy

Aurora: Clear nights offer excellent Northern Lights viewing

Daylight: 10-12 hours, perfect for photography and exploration


