


# Torngat Base Camp Adventure

Experience an immersive Arctic journey where towering fjords, dramatic landscapes, ancient Inuit homelands, and unforgettable wildlife encounters come together in the heart of Torngat Mountains National Park.





**Step into the heart of the Torngats, where polar bears patrol the coastline and millennia of Inuit history shape every breathtaking moment.**

Set within the dramatic fjords of northern Labrador, this exclusive Base Camp adventure offers rare and safe opportunities to explore bear country, encounter Arctic wildlife, and immerse yourself in the living cultural landscape of the Inuit.

Arrive by scenic charter flight from Goose Bay before transferring by Zodiac or helicopter into the heart of Torngat Mountains National Park. From this extraordinary location on the Labrador coast, you can experience unforgettable ground-level viewing of wildlife that may include polar bears and black bears patrolling the shoreline and whales moving through the icy waters.

Guided by experts including Labrador Inuit who call this region home, you will travel through remote fjords, visit ancient archaeological sites, and capture breathtaking photographs of one of the most rugged and storied landscapes in the Arctic. Each evening, return to Base Camp for chef-prepared meals, meaningful cultural stories, and warm hospitality set against the towering peaks of the Torngats.


## Itineraries | Choose from 3-night, 4-night or 7-night stays



### Day 1 : Arrival & Immersion

Fly from Goose Bay to Saglek via scenic charter, then transfer to Torngat Base Camp by Zodiac or helicopter. Take in the dramatic ridgelines and rugged Arctic coastline before settling in. Orientation and an afternoon hike introduce you to the landscape, followed by a photography workshop and evening bonfire with a cultural presentation by Inuit guides.

### Day 2 : Whales & Bears Excursion

Spend the day exploring Branigan Island and Jans Haven by boat. Search for polar bears, minke whales, and other Arctic wildlife while enjoying the pristine coastline. Afternoon talks from local guides or researchers deepen your understanding of the region's ecology and culture.

### Day 3 : Rose Island Expedition

Travel to Rose Island to explore archaeological sites and enjoy more wildlife viewing. A shore lunch is served, followed by a hands-on Northern-inspired soap-making workshop. End the day with dinner and an evening bonfire under the Arctic sky.

## Itinerary



### Day 4 : Hebron Historic (4 and 7-Night departures only)

Journey to Hebron to discover historic Moravian mission buildings, Hudson's Bay trading post remnants, and ancient graves. Picnic lunch included. Return to Base Camp for afternoon talks with guides or researchers deepen your understanding of the region's history and culture. Enjoy dinner and evening bonfire.

### Day 5 : North Arm Exploration (7-Night departure only)

Excursion to North Arm, featuring hiking to a waterfall, exploring archaeological sites, and optional shore fishing for Arctic Char. Afternoon friendly games at Base Camp, then dinner and evening bonfire.

**MEALS INCLUDED: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner**



### Day 6 : Torr Bay or Bear's Gut

Choose Torr Bay for a scenic hike with Zodiac pickup and lunch at Base Camp, or Bear Gut (available late August–early September) for a full-day expedition to see polar bears fishing for Arctic Char and other wildlife along the coast. Afternoon talks with guides or researchers, followed by dinner and bonfire.

## Itinerary



### Day 7 : Ramah Bay (7-Night departures only)

Full-day excursion to Ramah Bay for hikes through dramatic fjords, visits to archaeological sites, and a picnic or shore lunch. Option to participate in traditional Inuit games before returning to Base Camp for dinner and bonfire.

### Day 8 : Departure

Pack, capture final photos, and transfer to Saglek for charter flight back to Goose Bay.

## Destinations



### Torngat Mountains National Park

Welcome to Torngat Mountains National Park, a place where nature remains raw, powerful, and untouched. Here, Inuit history runs deep, wildlife roams freely, and towering peaks rise from glacial fjords. Whether you're walking ancestral lands with Inuit guides, searching for polar bears along the coast, or standing at ancient archaeological sites, Torngat offers an Arctic journey that feels both humbling and profoundly inspiring.



### Happy Valley – Goose Bay

Your journey into Labrador's North begins with a blend of cultural richness and frontier spirit. This lively hub offers a warm introduction to the region, where Innu and Inuit traditions sit alongside stories of aviation and military history. Explore local craft makers, visit cultural centres, and feel the anticipation build as you prepare to venture into more remote landscapes. Whether you're connecting with the community, learning about Labrador's heritage, or gearing up for your onward adventure, Happy Valley Goose Bay sets the stage with authenticity and northern charm.



### Saglek

Towering cliffs, sweeping tundra, and glacier carved fjords shape a landscape that feels ancient and powerful. Along the shoreline, centuries old archaeological sites reflect deep Inuit history, while the surrounding wilderness offers the chance to see polar bears and other wildlife moving through their natural habitat. Arriving here is a moment of awe, where culture, land, and wildlife come together. Saglek stands as a dramatic gateway to the Torngat Mountains, offering a true sense of place and connection to this extraordinary region.



## Accommodations

Remote and accessible only by air, our Base Camp sits in the heart of the Torngat Mountains, surrounded by dramatic peaks, pristine rivers, and untouched tundra. The camp provides a safe and comfortable base for exploring this rugged and wild landscape.

Accommodation includes a series of guest tents and domes, along with a main communal building that houses the kitchen, lounge, and the Parks Canada Visitor Centre among other facilities. Each heated tent offers space for sleeping, gear storage, and personal belongings, ensuring comfort while staying close to nature. Washrooms feature environmentally conscious facilities designed for minimal impact on the surrounding wilderness.

At the end of each day, gather in the communal building where our chefs prepare hearty, gourmet meals using fresh ingredients. Mealtimes provide an opportunity to share stories of the day's wildlife sightings, hikes, and discoveries with fellow guests in a cozy and welcoming atmosphere.

## Getting Here

Travel arrangements between your point of origin and Happy Valley–Goose Bay Airport (YYR) are the responsibility of each participant. Weather in this region can be unpredictable, and flight schedules may be affected. For this reason, we strongly recommend that guests booking reduced-fare airline tickets plan to continue their journey home from their gateway airport the day following the final day of the trip.

To ensure a stress-free return, we encourage guests to allow buffer time in their travel plans to accommodate possible weather-related delays.




## ! Contingency Plan

Arctic travel can be unpredictable. Weather or other conditions may delay flights to or from the Base Camp.

- If Day 2 flights are delayed, Arctic Kingdom will arrange accommodations in Goose Bay. Guests cover the cost of lodging, meals, and beverages.
- Due to limited hotel availability, guests may be placed in different hotels on different nights. Flexibility and understanding are essential.
- If Day 3 flights are canceled, an additional night in Churchill will be arranged at the guest's expense.
- If by 10 am on Day 4 flights remain impossible, the tour will be officially canceled, and trip cancellation letters will be provided for insurance purposes.
- Guests unable to leave Base Camp due to weather delays will remain at the cabins at no additional cost until flights can resume.
- AK will assist with rebooking hotels or flights, but any costs remain the responsibility of guests. We strongly recommend contacting your travel insurance provider before making changes.

This journey is perfect for travellers who want to witness wildlife in a truly wild setting while gaining deep insight into Inuit culture. Whether you're hoping to observe polar bears along the coast, spot caribou moving across the tundra, or learn directly from Inuit guides about ancestral lands and traditions, this adventure offers meaningful encounters at every turn. Photographers of all levels will find endless inspiration in dramatic fjords, rugged mountains, and Arctic wildlife.

### Dynamic, Weather-Driven Days

The Torngat Mountains are beautifully unpredictable. Your daily plans are shaped by conditions, wildlife behaviour, and opportunities created by the land itself. Some days may be filled with shoreline exploration, cultural interpretation, or wildlife viewing, while others may involve waiting for safe travel or embracing quiet moments in camp. Guests who enjoy spontaneity and connection to the environment will thrive here.

### Light Physical Activity

While the experience does not require strenuous physical effort, guests should be comfortable with short walks on uneven tundra terrain, occasionally ascending small hills or navigating rocky shorelines. Mobility is important for safely getting in and out of boats, moving around camp, and participating in guided excursions.

### Curiosity and an Adventurous Mindset

No prior Arctic or backcountry experience is needed, but an open, flexible, and patient mindset is essential. This is a remote environment shaped entirely by nature, wildlife, and Inuit leadership. Travellers who embrace the unknown, appreciate cultural learning, and enjoy being part of an intimate, diverse group will find this journey especially rewarding.

Inland may feel milder but coastal areas remain cool. Storms and sudden weather changes (wind, rain, fog) remain a risk. Snow on high peaks possible by late August/early September




This experience is conducted in collaboration with local Labrador Inuit communities, offering insight into traditional practices and cultural heritage. Guests may observe traditional hunting, fishing, and survival practices, gaining a deeper understanding of a way of life that has coexisted with the Arctic environment for generations. Respect for Inuit culture and traditions is encouraged throughout the journey.

### Flexibility


